

Torrence Lewis

Torrence Lewis is a federal appellate practitioner who handles complex commercial and criminal appeals in the federal circuits. He is admitted in and has practiced in the Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, Sixth, Seventh, Eighth, Ninth, Tenth, Eleventh and DC Circuits and the United States Supreme Court. Over 90% of his cases have resulted in published opinions. For much of his first decade as a practitioner he worked with Sidney Powell, former President and long-time member of the Board of Governors of the Fifth Circuit Bar Association.

Mr. Lewis is a *magna cum laude* graduate of the Indiana University Maurer School of Law in Bloomington, Indiana. He also served as Executive Articles Editor of Volume 80 of the Indiana Law Journal. During law school, Mr. Lewis was co-counsel, as student practitioner, in over thirty felony criminal appeals, including direct appeals and habeas litigation in death penalty cases, before the Indiana Court of Appeals, Indiana Supreme Court, and the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals.
